AFFIRMATION OF NATHAN TZIVIN

I, Nathan Tzivin, affirm the following under penalty of perjury:

1. I am a business associate of Eli Zoglowek, the CEO and Chairman of the Board of Soglowek Nahariya LTD. In approximately late 2008, early 2009, I accompanied Mr. Soglowek to assist him in conducting due diligence in connection with a potential purchase of the assets of Agriprocessors, Inc.
2. Mr. Soglowek and I conducted due diligence, to include speaking with Joseph Sarachek, the Trustee in Agriprocessors' Chapter 11 bankruptcy, and in inspecting the Agriprocessors' plant and facilities.
3. In January, 2009, Mr. Soglowek was sufficiently satisfied with our diligence that he signed a term sheet on behalf of Soglowek Nahariya LTD. offering to purchase the assets of Agriprocessors, Inc. for the price of \$40,000,000.
4. Mr. Soglowek had questions, however, concerning the fact that the United States Attorneys' Office for the Northern District of Iowa was asserting a right of forfeiture of Agriprocessors' assets in connection with a criminal case filed in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Iowa. Accordingly, on one of our trips to Iowa, Mr. Soglowek met with representatives of the United States Attorney's Office to address his concerns. I did not personally attend that meeting.
5. After Mr. Soglowek attended the meeting with representatives of the United States Attorney's Office, he appeared frightened and told me that the representatives had told him that if Soglowek Nahariya LTD. purchased the assets of Agriprocessors, no member of the Rubashkin family or any related entity could have any management, consulting or ownership role in the business going forward. Mr. Soglowek was told by representatives of the United




States Attorney's Office that if it was discovered that any Rubashkin was involved in the business going forward, the government would exercise its rights to forfeit the purchased assets.

6. I recall Mr. Soglowek calling his father after the meeting and expressing his deep concern about this issue, saying "why do we need problems with the FBI and the American Government".

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, I hereby declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing is true and correct.
